EVENTS AT A GLANCE

MBA ORIENTATION, JULY 1, 2019

New faces, new minds crossed the threshold of BVIMR on 1st July, 2019. An enthralling 21-day Orientation program was organized for the students of MBA first year as per the notification of AICTE, in order to familiarize the students with the institution, the faculty, their seniors, alumni and above all, themselves. The prime purpose of the induction was the enrichment of the students' personality and attitude, so that, the students could not only do well in the academic field, but also in their personal spheres. The week-wise overview of the program

WEEK 1

On the very first day, students were introduced to the various rules and regulations of the institution as well as their curriculum. They were given a tour of the campus by their respective class coordinators to get familiarized with facilities, like, library, sports ground, cafeteria, etc. Various other activities that spanned across the week were Human values, Entrepreneurship Development, Creative Art, Environment, Respect for Women, Neuro-Linguistic Programming, and Literary sessions. Students were also engaged in Physical Activity sessions, to ensure their fitness and were given essential tips to stay healthy in today's stressful environment. A special session on Human Values was organized by ISKCON Temple, which enabled the students to have better understanding of their spiritual self. A Group Discussion and Personal Interview session concluded the first week of orientation and made the students well versed with the faculty and each other.

Day 1: On the very first day, students were introduced to the various rules and regulations of the institution as well as their curriculum. They were given a tour of the campus by their respective class coordinators to get familiarized with facilities like library, sports ground, cafeteria, etc.

Day 2: On the second day, students had lessons on literary activities. They were introduced to EBSCO, an online research facility which the students have been provided with. To develop and promote entrepreneurship among students, ED lessons were also included. Lessons, like, NLP, helped the students to understand themselves in a better and methodical way.

Day 3: On the third, there were sessions on Research, Basics of Management, Current Affairs, Creative Art, Proficiency Module, Literary Activity, Social Media, and Human



Values. Sessions, like, Research and Basics of Management were helpful to students from academic point of view.

Day 4: On the following day, apart from the general lessons, there was a special lesson on Kolb's Learning, where students learnt about different types of learners and identified their own learning style and what suits them. A Poster-Making Competition was also organized on the topics, Global Warming and Digital India, which helped in spreading awareness among students through the means of art and creativity.

Day 5: A special session on Human Values was organized by ISKCON Temple, which enabled the students to have better understanding of their spiritual self. Lectures on Respect for Women, Environment and Time Management were also induced.

Day 6: GD PI A Group Discussion and Personal Interview session concluded the first week of orientation and made the students well versed with the faculty and each other. Students were called in batches of fifteen and were assessed on the basis of their communication skills, how they seize the opportunity to speak, validity of their points, and their alertness. Each student was also personally interviewed by the appointed faculty. The students were asked questions about their backgrounds, their career objectives, etc.

WEEK 2

Students were also addressed by our Honorable Director Incharge Dr. *Vikas Nath* on the topic: *MBA: A road to Success*. Various exams related rules were communicated by *Mr. Sanjoy Roy*. Students were given a glimpse of various societies and events that take place in the institute. Students were introduced to the college magazines, such as, *BVIMR MIRROR, FINANZA, and HARMONY* etc. A special guest talk on *How The Corporate World Works* was organized in order to make students familiar with the corporate world and its requirements. A *junior-senior* interaction session was organized which gave students an insight about the life of students in BVIMR. On the last day of Week 2, students were introduced to members of the placement cell, i.e., CRC (Corporate Resource Cell). An interaction with the alumni was also scheduled where the alumni members of the institute enlightened the students about their experiences in the institute.

Meanwhile, two days of the week were dedicated to bridge courses through which, students from non- commerce backgrounds were introduced to subjects, like, Accountancy, Statistics and Managerial Economics, so that, all the students could be at par with each other.

Day 7

The common activities that spanned across the week were Human values, Entrepreneurship Development, Creative Art, Environment, Respect for Women, Neuro-Linguistic Programming, and Literary sessions. Description of a few activities is given below: -

HUMAN VALUES

SWACHHTA PAKHWADA

Our hon'ble Prime Minister has launched a mission water conservation campaign 'Jal Shakti Abhiyan' and has also stressed to make India free from 'Single use plastic'. Under the guidance of Ministry of Human Resource Development, BVIMR observed Swachhta Pakhwada during 1stSeptember 2019 to 15th September 2019. A variety of activities were undertaken to align with the aims of Swachhta Pakhwada.

BVIMR formed a Jal Shakti Team wherein students under the guidance of Dr. Ashima Bhatnagar studied and monitored the status and problems faced by various water conservation techniques such as Rain water harvesting, Water shed development, water recycling etc. The students actively participated in the discussion and multiple meetings were held during Swachhta Pakhwada as brainstorming sessions were common with the Jal Shakti Team. They prepared a report on the same.

Some of the important issues which were discussed in the report are as follows:-



RAIN WATER HARVESTING

Rain water harvesting is a technique of collection and storage of rainwater into natural reservoirs or tanks, or the infiltration of surface water into subsurface aquifers (before it is lost as surface runoff). One method of rainwater harvesting is rooftop harvesting. With rooftop harvesting, most any surface — tiles, metal sheets, plastics, but not grass or palm leaf — can be used to intercept the flow of rainwater and provide a household with high-quality drinking water and year-round storage. Other uses include water for gardens, livestock, and irrigation, etc.

PROBLEM FACED

One of the natural problems that hinders the efficiency of rain water harvesting system is the uneven rainfall. Secondly, the cost of rain water harvesting system and its maintenance is very high and any monetary benefit from it can only be realized after 15-20 years. The system also requires accessories in some cases as the system may be prone to chemicals or animal droppings and this water when used will cause more harm than good. The storage capacity of the system can also be an issue during heavy downpour.

SOLUTIONS

Rain water barrels can be installed as they are simple and efficient ways of rain water harvesting. To prevent the barrels from becoming mosquito breeding ground, a table spoon of vegetable oil can be added in the barrel to cut off the oxygen for larvae breeding in water. A rain garden can be developed. Rain garden is a sunken landscape that uses native plants to remove pollutants from water and allows water to percolate in the ground. Splash block- They are a great way to divert rainwater from the building's foundation.

RENOVATION OF TRADITIONAL AND OTHER WATER BODIES TANKS

The large storage tanks whose command varies from 20 to 2000 hectares are generally constructed by the government departments or local bodies. Apart from irrigation, these tanks/ponds and lakes have traditionally played an important role in drinking water supply, hydropower, ecology, tourism, culture and other domestic uses.

PROBLEMS

They require large amounts of funds and are done over a long course of time which hampers the life of people around it, Heavy silting on tank beds, Use of tank bed as dumping yards, Choked up feeder channels, Deforestation



SOLUTIONS

1. Common area development
2. Afforestation
3. Desilting the tank beds
4. Repairs in leaks

3. WATERSHED DEVELOPMENT

Watershed management is the study of the relevant characteristics of a watershed aimed at the sustainable distribution of its resources and the process of creating and implementing plans, programs, and projects to sustain and enhance watershed functions that affect the plant, animal, and human communities within the watershed boundary.

PROBLEM

- i) Land degradation in rain fed areas due to soil erosion from runoff is one of the major problems. In India it was estimated that the soil erosion in the 1990s was almost double that of soil erosion in the 1980s.
- ii) Equitable benefit sharing of watershed management within the farming communities as well as within the different locations of watershed is a huge problem.
- iii) Acute shortage of water in general and drinking water especially in summer has been observed in many watersheds with inadequate watershed management which may result in severe/ recurrent droughts. It may often result in limited and temporary food productivity gains.
- iv) Many a times, common lands do not get treated adequately and re-vegetation does not take place as expected in spite of the watershed management programs. As a result of this, domestic/ ecosystem water needs and livestock water/ fodder needs are either inadequately addressed or are made to suffer due to increased water withdrawals by other uses or due to overgrazing.
- v) Problems exist or new problems crop up due to improper understanding of the interaction between biophysical and socio-economic processes in watershed management.
- vi) Conflict among various government ministries such as those related to agriculture [with emphasis on food production], rural development [with emphasis on employment generation & poverty alleviation], forests [with emphasis on maintaining biodiversity & wildlife], as well as conflict between government bureaucracy and elected representatives in their zeal to control funds, is a major problem in watershed management programs -which requires to be resolved on a priority basis.



SOLUTIONS

- i) Promotion of community participation for the cause.
- ii) Satellite images can be used to pre plan the interventions.
- iii) A small model of the watershed system can be made to see the implications of the larger one.

4. ENSURE ALL WATER HARVESTING AND WATER TREATMENT PLANTS ARE FUNCTIONAL

Water treatment is any process that improves the quality of water to make it more acceptable for a specific end-use. The end use may be drinking, industrial water supply, irrigation, river flow maintenance, water recreation or many other uses, including being safely returned to the environment. Water treatment removes contaminants and undesirable components, or reduces their concentration so that the water becomes fit for its desired end-use. This treatment is crucial to human health and allows humans to benefit from both drinking and irrigation use.

PROBLEMS

- i) Variation in turbidity- When plants begin to experience a variation in turbidity—the cloudiness of water due to the presence of a large number of particles—it can have negative effects on the quality of the process and effluent from the plant
- ii) Variation in flow- Many times, industrial companies make educated guesses as to what they think their flow rates are going to be. If an industrial facility is not equipped to handle these variations, they'll likely experience upsets to the system that will carry turbidity over and plug any downstream filters.
- iii) Changing feed chemistry- Many surfaces and well waters have seasonal variations in water chemistry.
- iv) There can be a lack of awareness in the updates needed in the quality requirements.
- v) Secondary waste- One of the biggest mistakes made in designing raw water treatment plants is not looking carefully at the secondary waste generated by the process.

SOLUTIONS

- i) Design a slightly oversized treatment system for turbidity, anticipating that variations will occur. It's also beneficial to design a recycle system so if the water doesn't meet the quality requirements as it moves through the process, it can be recycled through and retreated more thoroughly.

ii) Variable controls can be put on feed control system.

iii) Plants should be designed with some forward thinking in mind of what might be anticipated. It is also helpful to plant for expansion and quality improvement and allow space in the plant for adding additional equipment to handle changes in quality requirements.

Get a copy of the permit requirements, carefully analyze them, and design your wastewater secondary treatment processes and sludge handling to meet the effluent discharge of the plant water to the municipality.

PROMOTION OF EFFICIENT USE OF WATER IN CAMPUS

BVIMR's digital marketing society- Netlinx also took the onus to launch a digital campaign for the promotion of efficient utilization of water in campus. They focused on creation of various posters and short texts that emphasized on the various means through which efficient water utilization can be used. The campaign went on digitally via WhatsApp and Instagram till 13th September 2019 and was a great success as it helped in reaching out to every single student of the institute.

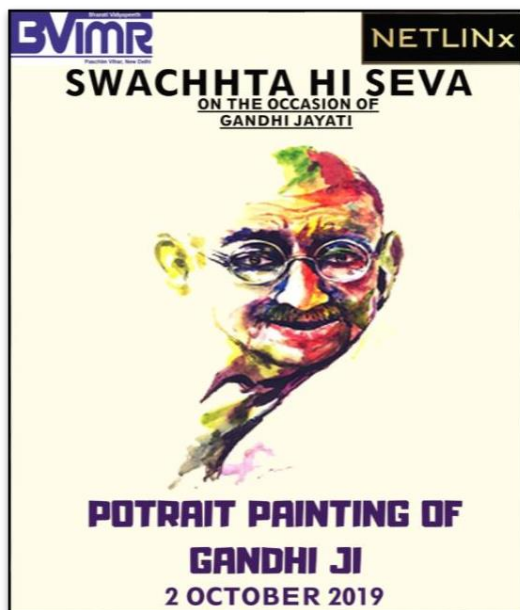


Figure: Promotional for Poster Making Competition

Overall, the event had good number of audience and participants to make it a success.

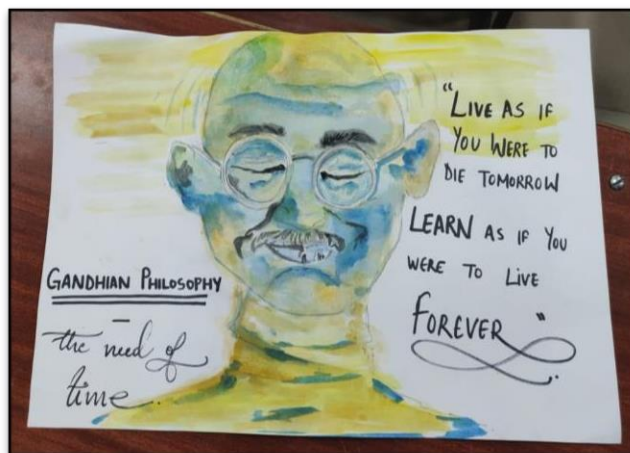


Figure: Creativity shown by participants during the Poster Making Competition.

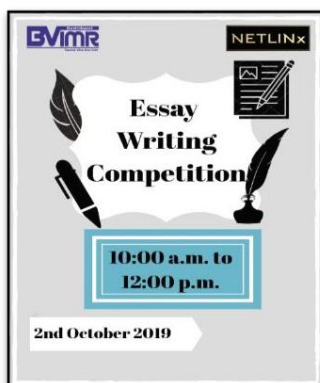

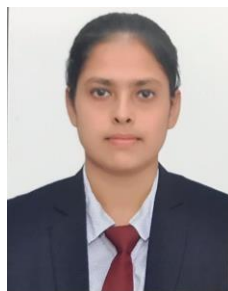
